## **Program Overview**

#### The PSP offers:

#### Paid 9-week hybrid summer internship: Full-time commitment (40 hrs./wk) Stipend: \$4000, June 13-August 16, 2022

- Stipend to conduct cancer research with UCSD/SDSU faculty mentor (30-35 hrs./wk) – NO research experience is needed
- educational seminars and in person/virtual group activities (~ 5hrs./wk)
- Opportunity to network with professionals in diverse careers in cancer research

#### Academic year (21/21): Part-Time Commitment (10-15 hrs./wk)

Exp. Stipend: \$2,000/semester

- Physical or virtual cancer research projects\* in biomedical (laboratory), clinical, behavioral, or public health research (10-15 hrs./wk.)
- Enrollment on a 1-unit Responsible Conduct Research course (Fall) and a 1-unit course, Cancer Disparities Journal Club (Spring 2022)– ~1 hr./wk., SDSU students only
- Networking opportunity to present your research at national or local scientific conferences and SRS
- Receive funding support for graduate exams (GRE/MCAT) and graduate application fees and coaching for graduate school applications

## Eligibility Criteria for Partnership Scholars

- Undergraduate student at UCSD/SDSU or community college transferring to SDSU/UCSD in Fall 2022, who
  - Has completed 50+ units by Spring 2022 and will graduate in 1-2 years (e.g., Spring 2023)
- Are citizens or permanent residents of the United States.
- Be a member of an underrepresented group in cancer research (NCI guidelines)
  - Individuals with a documented permanent disability(ies)
  - First-generation college students
  - Individuals from a low-income background or who grew up in a social, cultural, or educational environment where you did not have access to the knowledge, skills, or abilities that facilitate opportunities to participate in research careers
  - hose from underrepresented racial and ethnic groups:African Americans, Hispanics or Latinos, American Indians or Alaskan Natives, Native Hawaiians and other Pacific Islanders
- Interested in Cancer research/Cancer disparities
- Has the goal of obtaining a graduate degree(s) or certifications in
  - Research-based STEM research-based field (M.S./MSc, Ph.D.)
  - Public health (MPH)
  - Pharmacology (PharmD)
  - Clinical social work (MSW) OR clinical psychology (PsyD)
  - Health professional degree (e.g., P.A., RN, MSN, DNP, M.D., D.O.)
  - Other certificate programs related to oncology (i.e., Certified Genetic Counselor).
- Has a cumulative grade point average commensurate with acceptance to post-graduate degree programs (committed to graduate with an overall GPA of 3.0 or above)






